### DR. GORDON BUTCHER TO RETIRE IN OCTOBER, DEVELOPED A RENEWED CALL TO MISSION AT FIRST CHURCH

"Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace,  
according to thy word." (Luke 2:29)

After 45 years of inspired ministry, Associate Pastor Dr. Gordon Neil Butcher will retire this October. His plans are to continue in God's service while spending more time with family and friends. Hearing the announcement at Session, members expressed best wishes and deep appreciation to Gordon for exemplary service.

*"The time is perfect," says Gordon, who terms his decision as a call to leave. "I prayed that someone like Christine (Reverend Chakoian) with her unique combination of gifts would come to First Church. I could not feel better about where our church is headed."*

Working as a rural preacher in Indiana at age 20, Gordon distinguished himself in the pulpit, the gridiron and college. From his time with the Purdue Boilermakers and tending cattle aside his father, Gordon went on to graduate work at Notre Dame, obtaining his doctorate at Columbia Theological Seminary before serving as senior pastor in four churches: Presbyterian Church of Ogden Dunes, IN, Westminster Presbyterian in Youngstown, OH; Park Ridge (IL) Presbyterian and Edgewater Presbyterian in Chicago. He has spent the last five years at First Church working with missions, membership and deacons.

Mission work has been first in Gordon's heart. But it is his devotion to pastoral care that Reverend Christine noted as a special gift to our congregation. Several highlights include developing our connection with Hope Church, working on the membership rolls, and coordinating mission funding. Perhaps a key time of his tenure was the period of transition between ministers, *"a time of upheaval that really showed God's hand at work."*

*"I came here for the autonomy, the people and the chance to pursue mission work full time. This congregation has exceeded my hopes for church involvement,"* Gordon said. He noted his work with his fellow ministers and Mary Jane Hender on Reading Power, Paul Bubala with census and Bill Denniston on membership, as memorable. He looks up to Millicent Kreisler for her presence and Rita Fossell for the essence of ministry and thanks the staff for 'making ordinary people look great.' Everyone has helped with my ministry. I cannot be more grateful for (Rev) Christine's support, understanding and loving way."

With three grown children and two daughters -- Shay (15) and Chrissy (12) at home, Gordon and his wife Laurie will be busy managing an active Libertyville household.

*"All that I saw here, everything I worked for, came to pass,"* said Gordon, thoughtfully. He thanks the congregation for stepping forward and embracing the circumstances. *"We were able to heal and learn from it."*

Gordon's quiet demeanor and profound faith will be missed, but his lessons of faith and outreach remain a legacy.

## Caregiving Communication

Communication is the lifeblood of every relationship. It slowly brings about deep relationships, but only if we keep working at it. Like any other skill, communication is a matter of continued practice. The impact of the words we use when we speak with someone is considerable.

In his book *The Success Principles: How to Get from Where You Are to Where You Want to Be*, Jack Canfield, co-creator of the "Chicken Soup for the Soul" series, reflects upon mastering our words by suggesting that we speak with "impeccability." Often we don't stop to think about what we are saying, and words just roll off our tongues. The words we choose to speak, however, have the potential to build self-confidence, relationships and even dreams - words of affirmation, encouragement, appreciation, love, acceptance, possibility and vision. Canfield observes,

**"To speak with impeccability is to speak from your highest self. It means that you speak with intention and with integrity..."**

When you speak with impeccability, your words have power not only with yourself but also with others. To speak with impeccability is to speak only words that are true, that uplift, and that affirm other peoples worth. "As you learn how to speak with impeccability, you'll discover that words are also the basis of all relationships. How I speak to you and about you determines the quality of our relationship."

What we say to others creates a ripple effect: "If I express love and acceptance to you, you will experience love for me. If I express judgment and contempt for you, you will judge me back. If I express gratitude and appreciation for you, you will express gratitude and appreciation back to me. If I express words of hatred toward you, you will most likely hate me back.

"The truth is, your words put out a certain energy or message that creates a reaction in others -a reaction that is usually returned to you multiplied... Everything you say produces an effect in the world. Everything you say to someone else produces an effect in that person. Know that you are constantly creating something- either positive or negative-with your words.

"Always ask yourself. Is what I am about to say going to advance the cause of my vision, mission, and goals? Will I uplift the hearer? Will it inspire, motivate, and create forward momentum? Will it build self-esteem, self-confidence, and willingness to risk and take action?"

Often we use words that are damaging because we are not paying attention, not because we are bad people. "No one has ever taught us how powerful words can be." Speaking with impeccability has implications for what we say about others and idle gossip as well. Canfield shares his personal observations: "...when I gossip about another person, it (1) brings me down in the moment, (2) focuses my attention on what I don't want in my life - rather than creating more of what I do want, and (3) it literally wastes my breath."

Reverend Patrick T. Day was raised in North Carolina where his family still resides. A graduate of Wake Forest University in 1992, he received a B.A. in English with a minor in Religious Studies.

Patrick went on to earn his Master of Divinity Degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary in 1995.

He served as a Chaplain Candidate for the U.S. Naval Reserves. Reverend Day's first call was to the Community Presbyterian Church in Clarendon Hills where he served as Associate Pastor with Reverend Christine Chakoian. His ministry was in many areas with an emphasis on youth ministry. He met his wife, Katie, while in Clarendon Hills and they married in 1998.

Patrick left congregational ministry to serve as Director of Administration for a non-profit organization in Hinsdale in 2000. His work there was rewarding and fulfilling, but he felt called to return to ministry in the church. He accepted the call as Associate Pastor at First Presbyterian Church of LaGrange in 2002. He was asked to serve as Acting Head of Staff in January 2006.

Patrick has been ministering to children and youth and their families in a variety of ways at LaGrange. The rotational model of Sunday School was in its entrepreneurial stage and blossomed with Patrick's leadership. He wrote curriculum, developed sound administrative systems, & helped bring a higher level of competence and confidence among the teachers. Patrick moved the confirmation program from an educational class to a discipleship program that connects confirmands to each other and to adults in the congregation. Patrick loves to preach and has led traditional worship services and created alternative worship services.

Patrick says about leadership: "I bring a passion to what I do, seen often through my sense of humor. I love what I do, and I feel most completely myself when

engaged with a group around a topic of what a relationship with God looks like. It is my responsibility to help each person discover his or her gifts and use them for the glory of God."

Another quote from Patrick's Personal Information Form reflects some of his theological beliefs: "It is incumbent upon the church to seek new ways to reach people. I believe the gospel calls us to reach out to people wherever they are and help them find a more meaningful way to live. We can do this while proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ at the same time."

We feel blessed to have Patrick and his family joining our congregation on September 1 with your support and approval.

Patrick and his wife Katie have three children, Galvin (6 years old and going into the 1<sup>st</sup> grade) and twins Cora and Quinn (3 years old and starting preschool). # STRENGTHENED BY GOD'S GUIDANCE AND LOVE

## Decoding the Mysteries of First Church

Author Dan Brown stunned the publishing world with the *The Da Vinci Code*, a fictional tale which entwines Christian symbolism with legend and myth. But did you know that Christological symbols, signs and signifiers are encoded all around us, in reality...here at First Church?

If you enjoy a good mystery you can learn to decode the Christian messages embedded in the architecture, ornamentation, and furnishings in our church. Hiding in plain sight, are symbols that convey the message of the Gospel on many levels. Indeed, Christian symbolism has a long tradition in the church because the majority of ancient Christians were illiterate so church leaders relied on symbolism to convey the key insights of the faith through visual media. Now, when literacy is often taken for granted, these symbols may not register on our 'radar' because they no longer serve as necessary conveyers of the understanding of Christianity as they once did. A fifth century French peasant would have been more qualified to decode the symbolic carvings on our pulpit than many of us! Deciphering the codes will sharpen our perception of the meaning of the Christian symbols that are right before our eyes but we may not be attuned to 'see'.



In worship, our attention is focused on the pulpit where our pastor stands to deliver her sermon but...has your gaze ever fully 'seen' the pulpit itself? And...what is a pulpit anyway? From the Latin, "pulpitum", this elevated platform serves as a "stage, platform or scaffold" where clergy stand to read the Gospel and deliver a sermon. So important is this church furnishing that the phrase, "from the pulpit" has assumed a metaphorical resonance as that which is said with official church authority. Our pulpit serves as a condensed version of the Gospel message...for those who can 'see' it. Even the octagonal shape of the pulpit is potent with meaning because this eight-sided shape is evocative of the eighth day, the first day after creation, the first day of life. Enfolded further in this symbolism is the centrality of resurrection, the regenerated life that is offered through Christ. The applied carvings (see source number 1 for excellent detailed photographs) on the pulpit are an intricate interweaving of Christian iconography signifying the New Testament Gospel writers, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Their character is represented by apocalyptic verses from the Old Testament books, Ezekiel [I:5-10] and Revelations [4:7]. Looking closely at the pulpit you will discern images of a winged: man, lion, ox and eagle which [over time] came to signify the apostles, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John as well as aspects of the character of Christ. So let us decode this symbolism:

**Winged Man - Matthew - Jesus as 'Man'**. The Gospel of Matthew is represented by a man with wings, because his gospel traces the human lineage of Jesus.

*And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shall call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.* Matthew 1:21

**Winged Lion - Mark - Jesus as 'King'** Mark's Gospel [Mark 1:3], begins with the words:

The voice of one crying in the wilderness, which is suggestive of the roar of a lion.

The lion is often thought of as the 'king of creatures' and Mark's Gospel emphasizes that royalty of Christ as the Lion of Judah.

**Winged Ox - Luke - Jesus as 'Sacrifice'** The ox was an animal of sacrifice in the Jewish faith and is chosen as the symbol of Luke's Gospel which describes the sacrifice and priesthood of Christ

*"The Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be slain, and be raised the third day."*  
Luke 22

**Winged Eagle - John - Jesus as 'Resurrection and Life'** The Gospel of John is set apart from the three 'synoptic gospels' (synoptic meaning - presenting or taking the same or common view) of Matthew,

Mark and Luke because it has a soaring vision of the mind of Christ as the 'Word made flesh and as the Light of the world.' In ancient times, the eagle had a Christological meaning as a symbol of life and resurrection because it was believed that the eagle renewed its youth by flying up to the sun to scorch itself and then plunging to the sea. ...thy youth is renewed like the eagle's.  
Psalm 103:5

Take a moment that next time you are in the sanctuary to really 'see' the work of art and symbolism that is our pulpit.
